Way of the Roses Cycle Route

York is privileged to have one of Sustrans' iconic coast-to-coast routes running through the city. The Way of the Roses enters York through Sustrans woodland at Hurns Gutter, crosses Rawclife Ings skirts the Minster and leaves the city's boundaries through Sustrans 'Balloon Tree Copse' near Stamford Bridge.

North Yorkshire has more than 10,000km of public rights of way and offers off-road routes for cyclists and equestrians. These route cater for all abilities. They use mainly bridleways, green lanes and some unclassified roads. Some routes are rugged and hilly. Most of the routes are suitable for both horse riding and biking, read individual route guides for detailed information.
